WHAT IS AN "EVIDENCE-BASED" INTERVENTION?

(from section 8101(21)(A) of the ESEA)

"...the term 'evidence-based,' when used with respect to a State, local educational agency, or school activity, means an activity, strategy, or intervention that –

.demonstrates a statistically significant effect on improving student outcomes or other relevant outcomes based on –

- strong evidence from at least one well-designed and wellimplemented experimental study;
- 2. **moderate evidence** from at least one well-designed and well-implemented quasi-experimental study; or
- promising evidence from at least one well-designed and wellimplemented correlational study with statistical controls for selection bias: or
- 4. **demonstrates a rationale** based on high-quality research findings or positive evaluation that such activity, strategy, or intervention is likely to improve student outcomes or other relevant outcomes; and includes ongoing efforts to examine the effects of such activity, strategy, or intervention.

Additional Notes

School Improvement Award (SIA) - Supports evidence-based practices that address priority performance needs in schools identified as needing comprehensive support and improvement (CSI) or targeted support and improvement (TSI)

- CSI schools must use SIA funds to benefit all students
- TSI schools must prioritize identified student groups
- Look for research that supports the strategy, intervention, or program
